We welcome the fall season with its cooler temperatures after a very hot, dry summer. This is a good time to visit some Village items to help residents with questions they may have.

Firstly, let me thank our Code Enforcement Officer Bob Ryder for his sixteen years of service to the Village and before that with the Old Brookville Police Department. He has moved on to warmer climes and we wish him all the best in his new surroundings, and any new ventures he pursues.

Swimming Pools

This is the time of year when some swimming pools are being drained or water levels lowered. It is illegal to drain your pool into the street and storm drains. All water must be drained into a drywell or the lawn on the homeowner's property.

East Norwich Fire Company

The East Norwich Fire Company asks that residents prominently display their house numbers so that in the case of a fire or medical emergency no valuable time is lost looking for an address.

Construction & Landscaping

Landscapers are authorized to work in the Village Monday – Friday 8:00am – 7:00pm & Saturday 9:00am – 7:00pm.

Construction is allowed in the Village Monday – Friday 8:00am – 6:00pm.

No landscapers may work Sundays or New York State holidays: New Year's Day; Martin Luther King Day; Washington's Birthday; Lincoln's Birthday; Memorial Day; 4th of July; Labor Day; Columbus Day; Election Day; Veteran's Day; Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day.

No construction work may occur on Saturday, Sunday or New York State holidays.

Snow Removal

The snow will, no doubt come! When plowing your driveways, please make sure that snow from your driveway/property is not pushed into the right of way, or onto your neighbor's property.

Outdoor Lighting

Be considerate of your neighbors. After midnight, nighttime lighting should be reduced by installing motion detectors on outdoor lighting.

Roads

Since Irene, Sandy, and the past very harsh winter, I have received many inquiries concerning poor road conditions, rightly so, from our residents, and those from neighboring Villages. The Mayors and our Police Chief Richard Smith have contacted many County and State officials asking that repairs be done properly and quickly. As of this writing, Chief Smith has forwarded to me a response from the State that Northern Boulevard (25A) and parts of 106 and 107 will begin to be repaired "later this year".
