

GARBAGE DISPOSAL DISTRICT
Collection Rules – September 19, 2022

Carter:	Emmi Industries 366 North Broadway – Suite 410, Jericho, NY 11753
Collection Truck:	A small, 8-yard refuse truck.
Contact:	Call Joe Emmi at (516) 322-2099 with service questions or special needs.
Hours:	The schedule for trash and recycling collection days are as follows between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.: <u>Monday & Thursday</u> The West side of Wolver Hollow Road and all streets West of Wolver Hollow Road and South of Northern Boulevard. <u>Tuesday & Friday</u> The East side of Wolver Hollow Road and all streets East of Wolver Hollow Road.
Holidays & Snow Days:	There will be no service on the following holidays: New Years, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. If your pickup day falls on a holiday, collection will be the following day. If your scheduled day falls on the day after the holiday, you will be picked up the following day. For example, if your scheduled pickup is on a Monday and Thursday and the holiday falls on a Monday, your pickup will be moved to Tuesday and back on schedule Thursday. If your scheduled pickup is on a Tuesday and Friday and the holiday falls on a Monday, your pickup will be moved to Wednesday and back on schedule Friday.
Collection & Container Size:	Collection of two standard thirty-gallon containers, provided by resident, per pickup. Please contact Joe Emmi at (516) 322-2099 if you require a small estate container.
Recycling:	The Carter will pickup recyclable materials on your regular scheduled collection days.
Back Door Service:	The GDD offers Back Door Service meaning the hauler will drive up the driveway and collect the trash from bins and garages. If the containers are in the garage, the hauler will open the garage door, empty and replace the containers, and close the garage door. Residents will need to provide the Carter with gate and garage codes where necessary. Note: The Carter will diligently remove most items that are stacked next to, on top of, or leaning against the trash containers – so please keep items that are not trash in separate, distinct areas. Residents may also elect to leave trash containers to be collected at the curb on collection days.
Trees:	Christmas/Holiday trees will be picked up with regular weekly garbage.

Bulk Items:	<p>For bulky household items please contact Joe Emmi at (516) 322-2099. Bulky items include appliances, furniture, rugs, mattresses, washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, and freezers and other residential household items weighing less than 500 lbs.</p> <p>Note: Freon lines CANNOT be cut. NYS Law mandates that refrigerator doors must be removed before setting them out for disposal.</p>
Lawn Waste:	<p>Up to two (2) containers of residential lawn waste will be collected twice a week on pickup days. Includes: leaves, bundled branches, brush, plant trimmings and prunings, tree limbs (less than 6 inches in diameter) and grass.</p>
Emergencies (e.g. storms or a pandemic):	<p>During emergencies, such as severe storms or a pandemic, access to homes may be curtailed or the Village may generate excessive amounts of garbage. Residents may be limited to the amount of garbage per pickup or other necessary modifications.</p>
Snow Days:	<p>On snow days your driveway and road must be clear enough for the truck to reach the house for collections to occur. Please make sure snow is cleared from garbage receptable so they are accessible.</p>
Construction/Demolition Debris:	<p>The following items are not considered trash and will not be picked up: Bricks, mortar, concrete debris, cement rubble, stones, lumber, paneling, rolled insulated wiring, pipes, plaster, and dirt/sand that was part of a construction, home remodeling, improvement or landscaping project.</p> <p>If you require a dumpster for large construction and remodeling jobs, please call Joe Emmi at (516) 322-2099 or another disposal company of your choice, in each case at your own expense.</p>
Unacceptable General Items:	<p>The following items are not considered trash and will not be picked up: Dead animals, explosives, regulated household hazardous waste, flammable liquids, lead batteries, rechargeable batteries, car parts, hazardous or infectious waste, sludge, septic tank pumping, junk automobiles, medical or pathological waste, tree stumps, dirt, rocks, root balls, sod, railroad ties and animal waste.</p> <p>A substance is considered hazardous if it ignites easily, reacts or explodes when mixed with other substances, is corrosive or toxic. This shall include, but not be limited to, explosives, toxic materials, pesticides, fertilizers, compressed gas cylinders, propane tanks, oil, antifreeze, oil-based paint, solvents, rechargeable batteries, propane tanks or cylinders (full or empty) and mercury or mercury containing devices.</p>
Opt-Out:	<p>For subsequent years, any property owner seeking to have their property excluded from the District must file a written election on or before March 15th of the preceding year.</p> <p>Continued violation of these rules may result in expulsion from the District.</p>
Expulsion:	<p>Board of Trustees will have ability to remove a resident from the District for egregious violation of these rules once the resident has been put on notice and heard by the Board.</p>
